RECAP OF MAY NWSCC MEETING:

A lot of brainstorming took place at this meeting on a number of topics. When clubs receive their dues notice from NWSCC, it will include a form to report new club officers to FWSA for the Far West Skiers' Guide - in addition to information needed to update NWSCC's records and to update your club's information in the Northwest Skiers' Directory.

Sue Rimkeit of Cascade Prime Timers said that Nelson Bennett of Washington is a wonderful speaker who was involved with the 10th Mountain Division, the development of Sun Valley and White Pass, and early US ski racing.

Ideas are being taken for events that will help NWSCC celebrate its 30th anniversary - a big party is being planned for September 19, and skiing events are being considered. If clubs are looking for a place on the mountain for events in the spring and fall, Richard Rizk of Cascade Ski Club said that their lodge is pretty well open at those times of the year. Ski Fair is scheduled for November 9, though we don't have a location yet. It is planned to take place the Monday after the Portland Ski Expo (November 6-8), and before the Seattle Ski Show (November 20-22).

NWSCC's commercial membership program for the upcoming year is up and running, with sales manager Jessica Lee already contacting potential commercial members. Ski areas tended to be down in business 16-25% this past ski season, so there will be more bargains offered this year and sometimes comps can be had for as few as 16 people on a trip!

There was some brainstorming about how to get more people to the NWSCC meetings. Some suggestions were to check on a different meeting place, to have some meetings which are more "social," to try to get speakers more often, to maybe have clubs host a meeting, or to "piggyback" onto something fun. Speaking of fun, the August Council meeting will probably again be "Presidents' Night" at Sheri and Dale Parshall's home at Blue Lake.

RECAP OF 2009 FWSA RENO CONVENTION:

Well, if you weren't there, you missed a good one (but then, they always are!) The trips offered this year at the Silent Auction were incredible, and as usual they went for bargain prices - some less than half their value! In addition to ski trips to all of our favorite areas through the Western United States and Canada, some of the new and more unusual offerings were amazing packages at most of the major casino resorts in Reno, a whitewater rafting trip down the Colorado River in Utah with Holiday Expeditions, snowcat skiing at Big Red Cats in British Columbia, Atomic skis donated by Custom Ski Escape, and a 3 night/s day scuba diving trip for 4 people offered by the Hermosa Hotel on Catalina Island! You could have saved more than your airfare and lodging costs to come to convention just to win one of the fabulous auction items - with approximately \$100,000 in value of donated packages, the total amount received was approximately \$43,500! The facilities at the Peppermill (remodeled since our last convention there in 2001) were awesome!

But that's just one night and one event - the Convention's optional events Thursday and Friday included a "Hub Crawl" party at the Auto Museum, the third annual Michael German Memorial Golf Tournament, kayaking, a lunch cruise on Lake Tahoe, a pool party, and a tour of Virginia City. Then there was the chance at **Travel Expo** to meet one-on-one with ski area representatives and tour operators to get

firsthand information about places your clubs (or you) might like to go. Those who filled all their appointments and had their "passports" signed were put into a drawing for over 50 fantastic door prizes, including a grand prize of a trip to FWSA Ski Week 2010 at Keystone, Colorado.

A new opportunity for a special grand prize this year to support the FWSA Athletic Scholarship Program was provided by CMH Heli-Skiing/Heli Hiking (through our local celebrity and friend Fred Noble), which donated a \$5,000 3-day heli-hiking trip for two as the grand raffle prize! There were a number of other prizes, including ski trips, lift tickets, Council baskets, and a beautiful set of luggage also donated by CMH. Over \$4,200 was raised for scholarships at this year's raffle. Next year watch for an opportunity to support the scholarship program and put your name in to win the grand prize even if you are unable to attend the Convention - tickets may be available through your local Council.

Among the special guests at this Convention were **Deedee** Corradini, a champion of women in the events of the Winter Olympics; Jessica Jerome, 4 time US National Champion in ski jumping and a potential contender in the 2010 Winter Olympics IF women are allowed to compete in ski jumping; Auden Schendler, Executive Director of Sustainability at Aspen (and a highly entertaining speaker!); Chelton Leonard, ski executive and inductee of the University of Nevada Sports Hall of Fame; Ralf Garrison, with over 25 years of experience in destination resort strategic marketing and related infrastructure; Geraldine Link, National Ski Areas Association Director of Public Policy; Loren M. Kroenke, National Winter Sports Program Manager, U.S. Forest Service, Salt Lake Ranger District; Bill Clark, Executive Director, Western Ski Sport Museum & Western Ski Hall of Fame; and our special friend and long time Convention guest Billy Kidd.

Bergfreunde won first place for Outstanding Club in Class AAAA, as well as first in newsletter and website; Mountain High was first for outstanding website and second for outstanding newsletter in Class AAA, and NWSCC was first in outstanding Council website and second for this newsletter. Sandi Shaub won the Club History Award for her submission of Skiyente's 50th Anniversary.

A highlight of Convention is the unique opportunity for education specifically geared to running a ski club. This year's two "modules" in the **Snowsports Leadership Academy** were absolutely excellent, and included "Risky Business – A Slippery Slope" discussing insurance and liability, and "Travel Wise – Smart Tips for Trips" which partially discussed the new Trip Leader Guidelines Manual mentioned in the next paragraph.

In addition, every delegate at Convention received a CD-rom containing a great deal of information useful for ski club officers, including the 2009 Leadership Book, and contains chapters and files on:

- * Communications, including newsletter and website
- * Marketing your ski club
- * Marketing / Branding Consistently to Attract Younger Members

- * A comprehensive manual of Trip Leader Guidelines (one of the two educational seminars at this Convention) with forms, waivers, and more
- * Treasurer tips of what to do, and when
- * Snowsports Leadership Academy Module 1: I'm Elected, Now What - Taking a Club or Council Office (an outline from last year's convention)
- * Files and files and more files of information gathered over recent years from clubs, councils, and FWSA with procedures, forms, form letters, membership, the National Ski Council Federation, safety, sample ski club and council constitution and bylaws, treasurer and trip leader guidelines, and welcome pack ideas.

This CD contains an absolutely amazing amount of information useful to ski club officers, and should be required reading. Ask your club delegates or your Council to provide a copy - and think NOW about attending next year's convention scheduled for June 10-13, 2010, in Palm Springs, California.

The 25th Anniversary Rat Attack party was a huge success. At the Council meeting Randy Lew presented PACRAT with an award from the Far West Racing Association Championships from 2008. It was announced that the next FWRA Championships will be held at Mammoth Mountain the second weekend in April, 2010. NWSCC should try to plan another trip to Mammoth at that time for racers and others who just want to ski there.

FWSA's 2010 Ski Week will be at Keystone Resort, Colorado, January 30th to February 6th, 2010. This is the

only Colorado resort with night skiing. NWSCC has requested 40 spots on this trip, and will take \$100 deposits to hold a spot for you at this time. The Tour Operator will be Rocky Mountain Tours. Lodging will be announced soon, but pricing will probably be between \$1,000 and \$1,300 without air, and skiing at both Breckenridge and Vail will be included in the activities being planned. This year people will be able to arrange their own air, as long as they connect with the shuttle bus, so you can use frequent flier miles or obtain your own discounts. The **Keystone Nationals** will be held **January 27-29**, prior to the FWSA Ski Week. The cost remains at \$100 for three races and an awards banquet. This is a national race event where all racers from all over the country are invited and welcome to participate in races with race classes based on ability, age and sex. The 2010 FWSA Europe ski trip will be to Cortina, Italy, February 27-March 7, at a base cost of \$1,844 from SFO/LAX (plus airline fees & taxes of approximately \$303), with a pre-trip February 24-28 to Venice at an approximate cost of \$575, and a post-trip extension March 7-14 to Vienna and Budapest for approximately \$858. (Note you cannot go on the pre or post trips unless you are on the main trip!) See attached flier. Space is limited to 130 participants, and if you are interested in this trip, you should contact Norm Azevedo immediately, as unassigned rooms will be released on July 1, 2009!

Watch for details of a **Dive Trip to Mexico** to be scheduled in April or May of 2010!

FWSA Cruise in the fall of 2010 - Leaving Boston, visiting Portland, Maine; Bar Harbor, St. John, New Brunswick, Halifax, Nova Scotia, and Boston. The Cruise Company is putting together a package for this cruise. There will also be a package prior to the cruise to tour the Boston area. Pricing will be available for this trip at a later date.

FWSA offers one USA ski week, one European ski week (usually with pre and post-trip extensions), and a number of "adventure" trips. They have had cruises and a trip to Thailand, and are looking at possible future trips including a trip to Australia and/or New Zealand in August of 2011.
