From FWSA NEWS:

Women's Ski Jumping Summer News: Jessica Jerome picked up her 11th National title at this summer's U.S. Ski Jumping Competition in Park City, Utah on August 2nd with a win in the large hill competition. Nita Englund and Tara Geraghty-Moats took 2nd and 3rd place, respectively. The 16th Annual Springer Tournee, held the same weekend, netted Jessica a first place on the 90-meter course, with teammates Sarah Hendrickson and Nita Englund placing 2nd and 3rd. The Fly Girls are off to a great start for the coming season. The normal hill

Championships will be held in October, during the Flaming Leaves Tournament in Lake Placid, New York.

Far West Ski Foundation Plans for Giving: Everyone gives to their favorite cause or charity in some way or another each year. For organizations, a plan of action for raising funds for a favorite cause has to be laid out well in advance in order to mobilize necessary resources and execute the plan. The Far West Ski Foundation, an IRS 501(c)(3) charity, is both a destination and a channel for worthwhile snowsport programs, worthwhile in that they have a long term effect. The Foundation focuses on four principal target areas. First are the athletic programs for young people, including scholarships for scholar-athletes, and second, supporting USA Women's Jumping. The Foundation's support for both of these amounts to \$15,000 annually. Third is support for programs advancing the use of on snow rehabilitation for wounded servicemen and the broader public. Finally, the Foundation supports teaching about the contributions of snowsports to the world through ski organizations and museums. From the NATIONAL SKI CLUB NEWS:

Ski Banff-Lake Louise-Sunshine Joins the Mountain Collective: The Mountain Collective has added Ski Banff-Lake Louise-Sunshine as the 15th resort for the \$389 season pass collaborative, joining AltaSnowbird, Aspen Snowmass, Jackson Hole, Mammoth Mountain, Squaw Valley/Alpine Meadows and Whistler Blackcomb to their season pass promotion. Utah's 15th Ski Resort Will Open for the 2014/15 Ski Season: Utah's new Cherry Peak Resort will open this season near Richmond, Utah -- about 15 miles from Logan, Utah and close to the Utah-Idaho border, 95 miles north of Salt Lake City, and 175 miles west of Jackson Hole. It will be the state's first new resort built from the ground up since Deer Valley opened in 1981. The new resort sits on 200 acres serviced by 3 used triple chairlifts -- one from Whistler, one from Sun Valley and a third lift from Squaw Valley. Cherry Peaks will be one of those few resorts in the state to be developed private land and will be open only Monday through Saturday but will be closed on Sundays (a religious decision). It will also feature lighted night skiing, a magic carpet in the beginners' area, a 3-lane tubing hill, ice skating in the winter, and mountain biking in the summer.

Utah's 16th Ski Resort? A small 'locals' ski hill in Utah is set to be transformed in to a 'world class resort' over the next five years, if things go according to plan. Nordic Valley, 15 miles from Ogden -- between Ogden and Powder Mountain -- opened in 1968, then ran into financial problems and was

auctioned off in 2012. Its current owners have announced plans to build a new bottom-to-top gondola and develop a "European style boutique base village" at the foot of the slopes over the next five years. They hope to increase the area from the current 500 or so acres to over 2,000 acres and, for the coming 2014-2015 ski season, new ski trails are being cut on the higher slopes that will be accessed via snowcat.

Park City Mountain Resort in Legal Limbo: Park City Mountain Resort's future remains in legal limbo -- with Talisker Land Holdings, Vail Resorts, and Park City Mountain Resort (PCMR) engaged in an ugly property dispute that threatens to close the mountain for the coming 2014-2015 ski season. Judge Ryan Harris, the presiding judge, has said that PCMR's lease is null and void and this season's dispute seems to be whether PCMR should post a bond between \$6.6 million (PCMR's position) or 124 million dollars (Talisker and Vail's position). The judge in the case was supposed to have made a much-delayed decision on the bond size last week, but the 3 parties asked for yet another extension of the court-ordered deadline for mediation until September 5, leaving Park City's retailers, restaurants, lodging owners, and even ski clubs with trips planned to Park City this season waiting nervously to learn whether they will have jobs, customers, guests -- or the ski trip that they planned this winter. While the fate of Park City is in certainly in limbo and the resort's slopes might not even open this season, ski club trips going to Park City can still ski at Canyons and Deer Valley -- not to mention that you can always go around the mountain to Alta and Snowbird or Solitude and Brighton. (At 2 p.m. Denver time on September 5, there was not further information on this story).

Steamboat Fam Trip Announcement: Steamboat's 2014 Annual Steamboat Travel Agent & Group Leader FAM is scheduled for December 4-7, 2014. Participation is limited and registrations will only be taken through November 2, 2014. The \$239* registration fee for club trip officers and \$319 for guests (spouses, significant others) includes: Welcome cocktail reception, 3 nights lodging, 2 days of skiing, 2 days of equipment rentals, a 2-hour group ski or snowboard lesson, property tours for group leaders only, continental breakfast, on-mountain breakfast, trade show and dinner with entertainment, and discounts on ground transfers between Steamboat and the Denver and Steamboat/Hayden airports. Crested Butte Gets New Lift for Experts & Advanced Skiers, Snow Bike Program: Beginning next season, Crested Butte Mountain Resort will have a snow bike program. The licensing program has been set up to assure

snow bike users are properly trained in utilizing snow bikes, loading--riding--unloading chairlifts and are aware of the areas on the mountain that are closed to snow bikes. All snow bike users will be required to take a 2 hour licensing lesson to be approved to snow bike on Crested Butte Mountain Resort. During this time guests will be trained on how to load, ride and unload lifts properly with snow bikes. A snow bike guide will take bikers on a tour of the mountain to review areas that are closed to snow bikes, preferred routes, and general safety guidelines while enjoying the mountain.

Powder Mountain to Get a New Village: Sam Magazine reports that the Summit Series, which purchased Powder Mountain ski resort in 2013, has announced its plan for a village at the resort. Pending approval, Summit Powder Mountain will consist of 500 homesites and a village core. They also plan to upgrade the lift system and to expand the trails. Summit purchased Powder Mountain for a reported \$40 million through a crowdsourcing effort last year. It now owns nearly 10,000 acres, with 7,000 skiable acres on six peaks. The village core at the mountain's base will include restaurants, shops, and a variety of high-density residences. Some of these will offer "cultural residencies" for "artists, performers, scientists, activists, athletes and other change makers," according to the Summit Powder Mountain website. The village will also host future Summit Series events, gatherings that aim to "build community, catalyze entrepreneurship, address global issues, and support artistic achievement, in an effort to make our world a more joyful place."

Taos Ski Valley to Open New Terrain: Louis Bacon purchased New Mexico's Taos Ski Valley from the Blake family in 2013. Skiing pioneer, Ernie Blake, founded the resort in 1955. Taos Ski Valley will open new ski terrain on Kachina Peak this winter. The installation of a new chairlift, the Kachina Peak lift, reaching 3,795 meters above sea level, is one of the highest chairlifts in North America will enable the resort to increase the mountain's lift-served terrain by 50 percent. Taos Ski Valley has also upgraded its snowmaking system, helping the resort to be prepared to open Thanksgiving weekend, as well as to provide skiing from the top of the mountain earlier in the season. Taos is also adding 35 new acres of hike-to terrain this season called The Wild West Glades.
