Ann Cook from Mt. Bachelor provided fun retro ski clothes and a hilarious contest to see who among four contestants could dress in the clothes the fastest - with prizes! Bachelor from ski clubs across the country, and it would be nice for local clubs to welcome them to Oregon and show some hospitality if you happen to be at Mt. Mt. Bachelor's new theme is "someplace different," and they highlight this by telling clubs about MANY options for having fun in addition to skiing. This includes the "Ale Trail" map to 12 microbreweries in Bend (a party trolley also runs along that route), a Roundabout tour, cave tour, salsa dancing, sushi classes, and much more! The FWSA mini ski trip will be held during Oregon's Spring Break, and you could purchase an amenities package to participate in their special events if you own a home in Bend or Sunriver.

Karen Norton from Mt. Hood Skibowl told us about the \$1 million renovation to the Multorpor Lodge, including a new conveyor lift. The Snow Tube and Adventure Park runs all winter, and Cosmic Tubing under the laser lights and black lights has become a very popular event. Betsy LaBarge from Mt. Hood Vacation Rentals has managed vacation homes from Brightwood to Government Camp for 21 years. The homes are fully furnished and very nice, with updated kitchens, TV's, hot tubs; most have WiFi, and most are pet friendly. Guy Trombley of **The Mountain Shop**, this year's PACRAT bib sponsor, received a round of applause from everyone; especially the PACRAT team captains present. The Mountain Shop, located at 37<sup>th</sup> and Sandy in Portland, is the oldest skiing and mountain shop in the U.S., and is changing and growing. Guy said that by supporting PACRAT racing they feel they are supporting the spirit of the mountain; they also support bringing youngsters into the sport, as well as the Nordic races at Teacup and at the Mt. Hood Meadows Nordic Center.

If you want to have a stone grind tuneup using the same stone grinding equipment as the U.S. Ski Team uses, this is the only local place you will find. The Mountain Shop offers a Custom Performance Full Tune and Hot Box Wax with an exact base structure for expected conditions, base repair, hand filing, a base penetrating hydrocarbon hot wax, and 3 hours in a "ski sauna" to set the wax; followed by scraping, brushing, and polishing. PACRAT racers can show their bib at the store to get this special custom tuneup for only \$55 instead of \$75. Megan Lancaster told us about the second annual **Ski to Defeat ALS** event to be held Saturday, April 13, 2013, at Mt. Hood Meadows. Our own local celebrity Fred Noble is the honorary chairman of this event, which in its inaugural last year raised over \$160,000! 87% of the funds raised by the event stay in the community. Almost everyone knows someone who has been touched by ALS, an incurable disease which can strike all ages. The local ALS chapter provides a variety of services, equipment, and other support to local families who are dealing with this disease. The one-day ski event registration fee of \$75 (\$25 for Mt. Hood Meadows season passholders) gets participants a day of skiing at Meadows, 3 meals, 2 adult drinks, and

entertainment. Each participant is required to fundraise a minimum of \$150, and the ALS organization offers lots of help, with website space and automatic tracking of online donations to show how your goal is being met. There will be interim challenges and prizes between now and the event as people sign up or meet certain goals.

While anyone can ski as many or as few runs as they want, adding to the total vertical feet skied by all the participants, the competitions revolve around a challenge for the most vertical feet skied, with trophies for the most vertical feet skied by a man, woman, and team. Last year Dale Parshall was the winner, skiing over 66,000 vertical feet! This year clubs are encouraged to each start their own teams, and there may be a special "club challenge" as well. Our Director of Safety, Sylvia Kearns, introduced Coach Greg Dilger, who is also Vice President of PACRAT. Greg pointed out to the group that in winter you drive safely and watch stopping distances, and that you should be just as conscious while skiing. Most people who have been injured skiing/boarding say they were hit on the slopes. So treat the ski slope like a road - watch for people flying at you from the side or out of the trees. While you can't watch behind you, do try to keep aware. Greg has emphasized safety on the PACRAT racing courses, and helped improve safety by making "slipping" the courses mandatory for all racers. When the course is properly smoothed out by people sideslipping, it doesn't develop the ruts that can throw people out of the course and cause falls.

Helmets have been mandatory other places he has raced or coached, but not with PACRAT. Greg said that there is a difference between helmets designed for racing and those designed for recreation. If you take a fall at a low speed (like 2-3 miles per hour), wearing a helmet will make a huge difference in avoiding a head injury. The helmet may not totally prevent a concussion, but it will definitely help prevent it. Concussion warning signs to look for include any headache at all, nausea, or loss of consciousness. With any of these symptoms get the person to first aid right away. After a fall, or when a helmet has been used for years, it should be replaced - and Greg actually replaces his every year or two, as the technology keeps changing. He says that POC makes a great helmet.

Coach Greg has been offering race training to both children and adults for many years, and emphasizes safety in his training. Every Friday during the ski season he offers training on a modified GS course (similar to the PACRAT courses), with video analysis, at a cost of \$35. Randy Lew, President of Far West Ski Association, talked about the FWSA Athletic Scholarship program. This year \$11,925 in scholarships were distributed to 15 deserving young ski racers. NWSCC clubs have been scholarship donors for many years: this year Skiyente is supporting Ali Gunesch of Government Camp with the Erin Nicole Memorial scholarship (\$1,525); Mountain High is supporting Jordan Schweitzer of Mt. Bachelor (\$1,000); and Bergfreunde is supporting Dean Austin of Mission Ridge, WA (\$500). Corporate sponsors of the FWSA scholarship program are Whitefish Mountain Resort, Grouse Mountain Lodge (in Whitefish), and Karbon clothing.

NW SCC has its own scholarship this year, and is supporting Elyse Burandt of Spokane, WA (\$1,000). The lively annual PIE and goodie auction took place at this meeting, and \$452 was raised toward next year's scholarship fund!!

While Whitewater Ski Area in British Columbia was not able to personally attend the meeting, a short video was shown highlighting the ski area.

## **PACRAT INFORMATION:**

The first race was run in fantastic weather, and the results available on the PACRAT website pacrats.org/racers.html. Dale Parshall said in his report: The weather and course were great, with 188 racers showing up for the first race. The course held up great thanks to everyone's efforts with course maintenance. One team (Lab Rats) had an exceptional day, scoring 56 points to take the early lead. 11 teams are bunched within 12 points of each other between 2nd and 12th, and most of the rest aren't that far off. Don't be discouraged if your team is not near the top to start, as we have seen huge point swings in the past, especially if your team has full participation. We have four boarders this year and we'll score them with the 10% discount as prescribed by NASTAR. As for individuals, there's strong competition for fastest man and woman on the hill with Jay Pollock topping the men this race and Brenda Ackerson topping the ladies. If you haven't heard, we made some rules changes to clarify how some of the "sandbagging" issues will be handled this year. Check out the Operations Manual under the RACERS tab on the PACRAT website under the Upgrading by Strike System and Downgrading by Strike System sections. Our next scheduled race is at Ski Bowl January 27.

**NEWS:** Mt. Ashland needs YOUR help - financially this time. Mt. Ashland received a ruling this summer allowing it to proceed with the construction of two ski lifts, new runs, and expanding the parking area, but first it needs to raise money to finance the improvements. As a nonprofit, a successful capital campaign is essential to the success of the project.

Mt. Ashland has budgeted \$150,000 in contributed support to augment operational revenue. Realizing that goal will

assist the ski area in mitigating rising annual costs of doing business. Mt. Ashland began a fundraising campaign in June with the goal of raising \$350,000 to help the ski area recover from its operational loss during the 2011-12 season, cover current debt, and add a little padding to a reserve fund. Since June they have raised \$243,000 in donations and commitments, but they have \$57,000 to go. Please consider including Mt. Ashland in your year-end giving this year! #### FROM FWSA NEWS:

FAR WEST SKI FOUNDATION - Charitable Giving for 2012: The American Taxpayer Relief Act extends the rules for charitable contributions from IRAs or Roth IRAs to December 31, 2013. Individuals over 70½ years of age may transfer funds directly to a charity from their IRAs without it being counted as income. In addition, funds transferred prior to February 1, 2013, may be credited toward your charitable giving for the 2012 tax year. The Far West Ski Foundation can receive your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) and if desired, direct it to one of the Foundation's funds, such as the Far West Athletic Scholarship, the Westlund Fund (rehab through snow sports), Women's Ski Jumping, or Snowsports History and Museums. Send your QCD to President, FWSF, Box 861, Fallbrook CA 92088, or to John Reinhardt, Treasurer, FWSF, 5285 SW Meadows Rd #380, Lake Oswego, OR 97035.

Learn to Ski and Ride Month: Throughout January, ski resorts and ski areas across the country are participating in Learn to Ski and Ride month, running special programs for those who want to learn the fine art of skiing or boarding. Earn points for the President's Active Lifestyle Awards (PALA) through the President's Challenge. LSSM is a strong supporter of the First Lady's Let's Move initiative.

National Safety Awareness Week: In an effort to raise awareness of ski safety among skiers and snowboarders, many ski areas are hosting safety themed events and activities from January 19 to 27th. From taking precautionary measures before hitting the slopes, to knowing how to recognize something as minor as a sunburn, or as major as

recognizing avalanche danger, resorts will ramp up their efforts to engage the pubic on best practices when it comes to skiing safely. Everyone should become familiar with "The Code," which is seven simple rules to follow:

- \* Before using lift, make sure you know HOW to use it;
- \* Always remain in control and be able to stop or avoid others on the hill;
- \* Don't stop where you will obstruct traffic flow on the hill;
- \* Yield to the skier in front of you;
- \* Always look uphill before starting across a hill and yield to downhill traffic;
- \* Use devices to prevent runaway equipment;
- \* Observe all posted signs and warnings, staying away from closed runs or areas.

NASTAR finals in Aspen/Snowmass: NASTAR has announced that Aspen/Snowmass will host the 2013 and 2014 Nature Valley NASTAR National Championships. Skiers will compete at the resort for national titles in various divisions. To qualify for the 2013 Championships, which are set for March 20-24, NASTAR racers must earn a top five ranking in their age and ability category by February 18, 2013.

Happy Anniversary: The Mt. Hood Ski Patrol is celebrating 75 years of service this year, and will celebrate with a reunion and history event on February 21st in Portland. In addition to the Free Ski Shuttle, a number of ski resorts offer their own free ski shuttles, such as Alpine Meadows, Squaw Valley, Homewood Mountain Resort, Northstar California and Diamond Peak.

#### LAS VEGAS RESORT DONATES HELMETS TO KIDS

The Las Vegas Ski & Snowboard Resort has donated over 1,000 ski helmets to local children this season in a program called Lids for Kids. The program after an 11-year old girl died while sledding in a restricted area near the resort.

STEVENS PASS TO GET NEW LIFT: The new owner of Washington's Stevens Pass, CNL Lifestyle Properties, has announced a new \$4 million on a ski lift and skiing terrain addition to begin in April and be complete by December. The resort will replace an existing chair lift in Mill Valley at Stevens Pass with a high-speed lift that should cut the ride time in half, the company said. CNL Properties is a nationwide real estate investment trust based in Orlando, Fla., that also owns the Summit at Snoqualmie Resort at Snoqualmie Pass, in Washington.
